



YEAR 5/6 ROUNDERS COMPETITION

- Teams consist of 10 players from a maximum squad of 12.
- Maximum entry of 2 teams per school.
- Schools will play each other in a round robin format.
- Packed lunch required.
- Games will be at least 20 minutes. Schools are encouraged to bring resources that will keep children busy during off periods.
- Pupils must come dressed for outdoor weather on grass pitches.
- Spectators not permitted.





Y1/2 OUTDOOR CRICKET FESTIVAL

- The Year 1/2 Cricket Festival involves a carousel of activities for your pupils to practice and develop fundamental movements while taking part in fun challenges.
- The event will be lead by the Durham Cricket Foundation.
- Activities will be led by leaders/coaches wherever possible. If staff have to lead on activities, schools will be made aware prior to the event.
- Schools may enter a maximum of 2 team, which consists of a maximum of 15 pupils.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators not permitted.





YEAR 3/4 ORIENTEERING FESTIVAL

- Staff are required to take part in the course with their pupils so please come dressed for outdoor activity.
- Maximum of 2 teams per school.
- Children should have appropriate clothing and footwear for outdoor activity.
- Teams consist of a maximum of 10 pupils and a minimum of 6.
- Schools must bring two members of staff to the event who are physically able to complete an orienteering course. Staff must stay with that same group, and can only complete the course once.
- 5 minutes will be added to a schools final time if the same staff member has ran the course twice.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools prior to the event.
- spectators not permitted.





KEYSTEPS GYMNASTICS COMPETITION

- The event will have the following categories – Key Step 1, Key Step 2, Key Step 3 & Open Category.
- Schools may enter 1 team (to begin with) of 6 pupils per key step (not the open category however).
- The open category is open to Years 1–6 but all pupils must complete the Key Steps 3 routine regardless of their age. The open category is designed for pupils who take part in two or more hours of gymnastics each week.
- Teams with the highest points per category will progress through to the County Finals.
- Whilst this is a team competition, pupils will perform in front of a judging panel alone, with their scores adding up to an overall team score.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools prior to the event.
- The event will also feature a 'festival' portion of the event whilst the judging is happening, including trampolining and vault.
- spectators not permitted.





YEAR 3/4 MINI TENNIS

- Teams consist of 4 boys and 4 girls and games will be versus the same gender. Should schools not be able to field a full team on the day, schools may substitute their player for a pupil of the opposite gender. In this instance however, the game will be automatically won by the other school 12-0.

YEAR 5/6 ORIENTEERING FESTIVAL

- A member of staff must be with their group of pupils at all times so please come prepared for outdoor activity.

GATESHEAD GIRLS UTD: YEAR 4/5 FOOTBALL

- Schools can enter a maximum of 2 teams.

- Teams will play one another in their group in a 'round-robin' format.
- Rolling substitutes throughout games (ideally during a break in play if possible).
- Players MUST wear shin pads at all times.
- Players MUST wear suitable footwear for 3G pitches (metal studs not permitted).

- Unfortunately due to the size of the event, number of teams and pupils permitted, the space around the football courts is very limited. On this occasion no spectators permitted.
