What is respect?

RESPECT is the feeling of admiration for someone or something caused by their abilities, qualities, or achievements.

What Is The RESPECT Project?

This project gets you thinking about what does respect mean to you? How does respect affect others? How can we incorporate this into everyday life? What are the challenges surrounding this?

Your task is to design a front cover for the 2025
Gateshead Schools Dance Festival programme. You must include the Olympic / Paralympic Games value of RESPECT in the design.

HOW TO DESIGN A FRONT COVER

What Is The Theme?

Your work needs to link to the 'OPEN' theme of this year's Dance Festival meaning that schools can perform any type of dance they wish. The Programme design should celebrate the 'power of dance' and the event in general – think about the venue; The Glasshouse, the number of dancers (roughly) 2,500, and all of the hard work that goes into getting ready to perform. Your design must incorporate the Olympic / Paralympic Games value of RESPECT to show how the Dance Festival is inclusive and open to everyone.

How To Design A Front Cover?

- RESEARCH the theme of RESPECT and take note of important Dance Festival information to make sure that you have all of the key details that you need to include. For example festival dates, venue etc. as well as any design features you want to include.
- PLAN your design. Use a picture board to try a
 few different ideas before producing your final
 Dance Festival programme front cover design.
- CREATE your front cover making sure that you include all key information. Use images and illustrations to make your design eye-catching and 'stand out from the crowd'.





PLANNING YOUR FRONT COVER

Before you begin to design your front cover you should plan what you're going to include in it first.

PLANNING YOUR FRONT COVER

Broad / Open Approach

This year, the Gateshead SSP will not be setting a discrete theme/narrow focus for the Dance Festival.

Instead we are opting for a more broad approach building on the continued success of previous years.

Key Focus Areas

There are 3 key focus areas to draw your attention to when creating your 2025 Dance Festival Programme Design:

1. UNITE

A celebration of how the event will UNITE young people from across Gateshead. The importance of connecting with others, developing relationships, team work etc.

2. INSPIRE

The power of dance to inspire and engage others with a focus on movement and physical activity.

3. RESPECT

Remember to also incorporate this projects theme of <u>RESPECT</u> into your designs too!

Now it's time to plan your own Front Cover Programme Design! Your teacher will set a time limit to start your research and plan your design. You could use a 'Picture Board' to help plan your design. Here's an example picture board and the final design brief to help you get started!

Here are 3 very different drawings/pictures of the event venue (The Glasshouse). Could these images help you create your very own picture of The Glasshouse?......







After a search on "RESPECT" these were a few of the top images found. We felt they shared the Olympic and Paralympic Value of Respect and what it means and the importance of Respect in everyday life and within our Dance Festival.



After a search on 'Dancing' these were a few of the images found. They are in very different styles – the image on the righ looks colourful and cartoon-like, as though it might have been drawn by a young child. The blue image on the right looks like a sketch and shows different dance moves being performed.



THE AUDIENCE





These pictures on the left show large audiences. You need to think about who might be spectating at the Dance Festival and what they would like to see. Could you include an image of an audience in your final design to help show that the event attracts a large number of spectators...

Picture / Design Board

When you looked at the designs from other dance festivals on the last slide could you guess what the brief was for design A?

If you look closely the picture in the design was linked to EQUALITY, the theme of the last Dance Festival (2024). The designer might have used a 'picture board' to help with ideas; using books, magazines and the internet to find pictures and graphics to help them with their final design.
